Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy
<p>This module will involve lectures and tutorials covering the content of the module. Tutorials will be designed around Problem and Simulation Based Learning. In each alternate week, you will be presented with a problem that needs to be solved in groups. The weeks in which you are not doing a tutorial, you will be doing your own research. This will ensure student-led learning.</p> <p>To assess learning outcomes, 1, 2, 3 and 4, you will be asked to work in a team and give a presentation on one of the pertinent emerging issues in logistics and supply chain management. The group presentation will be on an agreed topic of interest and is worth 30% of the overall mark. Supplementary assessment, if required, may be on an individual basis.</p> <p>To assess learning outcomes 1, 2 and 3, you will be asked to provide coursework responses to any one topic covered in the module for an organisation where there is extensive use and application of logistics and supply chains. You will select one aspect of the topics covered for the coursework submission which is worth 40% of the overall mark.</p> <p>A final multiple-choice examination assesses all learning outcomes.</p>
