Module Aims The module will prepare the trainee Nursing Associate to work with interdisciplinary teams to provide effective complex care.

Outline Syllabus

Medicines Management: safe administration of medicines by enteral, inhalation routes, recognizing and responding to side effects of medication; supporting medicines adherence and concordance with treatment.

Managing Nutrition: artificial nutrition and hydration, naso-gastric feeding and enteral care, administration of medications via enteral route, Collect and interpret blood glucose specimens, Sub-cutaneous insulin.

Managing Continence: supporting continence, female, male and ISC catheterization, other devices.

Recognizing and Monitoring Care: SBAR, caring for the unconscious patient; neurological observations, using risk assessment tools, supporting breathing, nasal and oral suction, oxygen therapy, peak flow, oximetry, sputum specimens.

Communication and managing Care: reporting and referral within the interdisciplinary team, End of life care, care of the deceased; managing pain, techniques, distraction, diversion, behavior support.

Critical reading, level 5 writing.

Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

This module will use a blended approach to learning involving face to face lectures and workshops. Students will develop understanding and application of their knowledge through the use of lectures, seminars and practical sessions which will be evidence based and research informed. A blend of synchronous lectures plus asynchronous objects including the use of LT. These will facilitate the achievement of LO 1,2, 3. Tutorials will facilitate LO4.

Learning will be supervised in Hub and Spoke practice placements. Supervised learning in practice will facilitate application of theory to practice and reflection on practice. Practical skills will be consolidated in the practice setting with an option to practice some skills face to face if there is no opportunity to experience a particular skill in practice.

Web-based resources, including the VLE will support achievement in all learning outcomes and application to practice. Formative feedback will be available through tutorials. This module will be delivered concurrently, the tutorials across both modules will provide an opportunity for formative feedback.
