Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

This module will record, at the end of stage three, whether you have completed the required number of placement hours to achieve qualification (BSc) or proceed to the next stage of study (if you are undertaking the MNurse programme).

The achievement of the Professional Values, Summative Episode of Care, Medicines ManagementAnd Performance Proficiencies are recorded and assessed in each of the accompanying practice modules.

The Nursing and Midwifery Council (2023) Standards for pre-registration nursing programmes require students to complete 2,300 hours of practice learning by the end of the programme (single field of nursing), these have been distributed across the programme to support your learning and achievement of the Future nurse: Standards of proficiency for registered nurses (2024). Stage three of the programme has been mapped to Part three of the MYEPAD and practice learning opportunities have been scaffolded throughout the stage to support your skills development, knowledge and understanding.

BSc students, you need to have achieved 100% of the programme practice hours and have had these verified and signed in the MYEPAD by the end of the programme. If all practice hours are not verified and signed in MYEPAD this module will be recorded as a fail and you will not be eligible for your BSc award. MNurse students, to be eligible to proceed into the next stage/ part of the programme you must achieve a minimum of 85 percent (680 hours) of the allocated practice hours and have these verified and signed in the MYEPAD by a Practice supervisor/Practice assessor. If you do not complete and have evidence of 85 percent of the verified practice hours at the end of the stage, the module will be recorded as a fail and you will not be eligible to progress to the next stage of the programme until the hours have been completed.

Throughout the stage you will have support from your Academic Assessor to discuss and monitor your achievement of the practice hours requirement. You will also be supported throughout your programme journey by your Personal Academic Tutor who can offer support, advocacy and signposting.

Throughout this stage, support will be available as detailed in practice module three.

MNurse students, at the progression from stage 3 in to stage 4, if you have completed 85% of the hours (680 hours) and you have completed any deficit hours from stage 2 of the programme, you will be eligible for this module to be referred into stage 4 of the programme. You will need to successful complete the module by the end of stage 4.
