Guest speakers from relevant agencies and/or professions will also be invited to offer workplace perspectives and to enhance student connections between theoretical and work-based approaches.</p> <p>You will be assessed on your ability to demonstrate that :you have knowledge and understanding of relevant legislation and policies that affect social work practice; you can interpret and analyse examples of theoretical perspectives and apply them to social work with adults; you have the ability to critically analyse current research and contemporary policy drivers toward working collaboratively across professional boundaries; you can apply anti-oppressive practice.</p>
