# Module Aims

To develop an understanding of issues associated with working across professional boundaries and between different disciplinary groups.

#### **Outline Syllabus**

Legislative and policy context to interagency work with children and young people; multidisciplinary, multiprofessional, and multiagency working; whose boundaries?; organisations, power and interagency work; partnership, collaboration and networking; lessons from childcare tragedies; the importance of interagency working in safeguarding children; barriers to effective interagency work; active promotion of effective joint working; Children's Trusts and sharing information principles and protocols; Early Help; reflective practice and work with others; interagency working around: domestic abuse; parental substance misuse.
