Outline Syllabus

The social construction of family; direct work with families; engaging with and working in an empowering way with families; culturally appropriate responses; working with families in crisis; assessing and dealing with risk; parental determinism; parenting styles; family support; parenting education; principles of early help; an ecological approach; domestic abuse; parental substance use; impact on parenting of parental mental health; family policy and underpinning ideologies; interventions to support families and parenting; reflective practice.

Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

This module has two assessments: a 1,500 word essay and a group presentation. For the presentation, students will work in groups to develop a parenting education programme covering any relevant topic.
