<p>What is research? Analysis, interpretation, reporting. Descriptive statistics. The nature and process of social research. Reflexivity. Participatory research. Ethics. Being research-minded. Research designs. Qualitative methodologies. Research and literature reviews. The uses and abuses of research (limitations, selective reporting, the role of evidence).</p>
