# Module Aims

The individual final year project aims to consolidate your learning in previous stages by expanding your knowledge of a relevant topic area which has been covered through the course of your study. By employing research strategies and undertaking focused inquiry on a chosen topic area which relates to working with children, young people and families, you will develop both your knowledge base and the skills needed to gather and present relevant information in a critically reflective way.

## Outline Syllabus

You will be completing your final year project with support through a series of focused lectures and tutorials, as well as support from a named project supervisor, who will provide individual/group tutorials. You are also expected to undertake in depth research/inquiry in order to produce reflective and analytical written work (LO's 1-4). In the contact sessions, you will be asked to take an active role by contributing to large and small group discussions as a means of further developing your ideas. In addition, project tutorials (with an allocated supervisor) will assist you in the development and progress of your work (LO 4).

The final year project assesses all learning outcomes (LO's 1-4). In addition, this module is designed to help you achieve the following transferable skills:

- Written and oral communication
- Time management and organisation
- Critical thinking
- Problem-solving
- Independent and supervised working
